The Betrothal Covenant at Mount Sinai

- The ketubah is a Jewish legal marriage document; it includes couples' vow to each other
- Even in modern times couples put up their marriage document at home
- The Torah and all the details Israel agreed to were their wedding vows
 - This is Israel's "I do"
- The sealing of the covenant (Ex.24:4-8)
 - No covenant is made without the shedding of the blood
 - The blood shed was innocent blood
- This covenant was unto death to break it means death penalty
- The New Testament says: Torah itself reveals our sins.
 - To break it is to get death
 - The only way to be cleansed from that penalty is through the blood of the innocent lamb

The Marriage Supper at Mount Sinai

- The covenant had been made, bulls sacrificed, covenant sealed with blood
- The Marriage Supper
 - God called Moses, Aaron, Nadab, Abihu and the elders of Israel to come up to the mountain (Ex.24:1-2)
- Mount Sinai was divided into two tiers like the Temple's Holy place and the holy of holiest
- They saw God and ate and drank (Ex.24:9-11)
- The Person they saw was the pre- incarnate appearance of God The Son, Jesus
- Moses went further up the mountain and stayed 40 days and nights (Ex.24:15-16)
