## **Episode 39 Where Does Jesus Return**

#### I. JERUSALEM

- A. Most Christians today would say Jerusalem because of two proof texts
  - Zechariah 12-14
  - Acts 1
- B. The armies of the Antichrist are ravaging the land, Jesus comes back to fight him, standing on the Mount of Olives (Zechariah 14:3-4)
  - However, the passage does not say explicitly that Jesus will land here
  - 2. "In that day" is a general statement, in the time period of His return
- C. The events in Zechariah 14 are not necessarily chronological, rather it is laying out a series of statements
  - The inhabitants fleeing after Jesus' return doesn't make sense
- D. When He returns, the citizens of Jerusalem will look upon the one they have pierced; they will go into their houses and repent, not flee (Zechariah 12)
- E. He is marching from the South, destroying the Antichrist's armies (Zechariah 9)
- F. It makes more sense to say that Jesus will be seen, perhaps in the clouds, over Jerusalem when He returns before He actually makes His arrival in Jerusalem from the South
- G. Jesus ascended to heaven on the clouds, so He will return on the clouds but not necessarily in the exact same place (Acts 1:9-11)
  - The disciples were actually about 2.5 miles from the Temple Mount itself
- H. Jesus returns with myriads of angels, it wouldn't really make sense for him to land and then bounce somewhere else

## II. PETRA/BOSRA

- A. This is modern day Jordan
- B. Some of the primary texts mention Jesus marching through that area (Isaiah 34, Isaiah 63, Habakuk 3:3, Micah 2)
- C. However, these texts do not say that this is where Jesus starts His march

#### III. MT. SINAI

- Further south from Jordan
- B. There are clear scriptures that state that Jesus will come from Sinai, but again, He does not likely originate there

## **Episode 39 Where Does Jesus Return**

#### IV. EGYPT

- A. It seems likely that Jesus, as the greater Moses, Joshua, Gideon, will retrace the entire Exodus, originating in Egypt
- B. Jesus will rescue those who have been taken captive in Egypt as He makes His way through Saudi Arabia, through Jordan, to Jerusalem, saving His people along the way
- C. However, He does not call us to get caught up in the details of this journey
  - He calls us, rather, to know the signs of the times and be prepared
- D. The Lord will bring you back to Egypt (Deuteronomy 28:68)
- E. The Lord is riding on a swift cloud, coming to Egypt (Isaiah 19:1)
- F. God brings Him out of Egypt (Numbers 24:7-8)
  - 1. The ultimate fulfillment of this prophecy is when Jesus returns
- G. Just like when He destroyed the Midianites in the first Exodus, He will do this again in His return (Isaiah 10:24-26)
  - In the context of the Lord destroying the Antichrist, His staff will be lifted up over the sea, like in the first Exodus (splitting the sea)
- H. The Lord will gather His people and destroy the tongue of the Sea of Egypt (Isaiah 11: 11, 15)
  - Just like in the first Exodus when His people crossed the Red Sea
- The sea itself will surrender (Habakuk 3:8-10, Revelation 19)
- J. The strongest Biblical case for the point of origin of His return is Egypt

## **Episode 40 Jesus Will Return in a Pillar of Cloud and Fire**

IN MATTHEW 24:30, JESUS TALKS ABOUT "THE SIGN OF THE SON OF MAN". THE SUN GOING DARK AND THE MOON TURNING TO BLOOD, ETC, ARE NOT IN THEMSELVES THIS SIGN. I BELIEVE WHEN JESUS RETURNS, IT WILL NOT BE IN A WAY MOST CHRISTIANS OR JEWS ARE NOW PICTURING.

#### THE PILLAR

- A. Exodus 13:21–22, Exodus 14:19–20
  - the pillar of cloud (and the fire by night) that led Israel throughout the exodus was the angel of the Lord, a manifestation of God Himself
- B. Exodus 14:24
  - 1) the Lord is described as being within the cloud itself
- C. Exodus 19:16-20
  - all the imagery of Sinai is applied to the return of Jesus; His return is the greatest theophany
  - as terrifying as they were, the events at Sinai are intended to be understood as a faint foreshadow of the greater glory that is to come: Jesus' return
- D. Exodus 23:20–23
  - 1) this is similar to what God said when He spoke in Luke 9:35
  - the pillar of cloud and fire was much more than just a pillar; it was the angel of the Lord Himself
- E. Exodus 33:7-11
  - what a glorious scene
  - how did a Jew know that God's Presence was with them? When the pillar showed up
    - a) 1 Kings 8:10-11

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### II. THE CLOUD RIDER

- A. Deuteronomy 33:26, Psalm 68:4
  - the exodus cloud was in the very specific form of a pillar; and when Scripture refers to the Cloud Rider, it is referring to the One who's riding in the pillar of cloud
- B. Daniel 7:13-14
  - when Jesus returns, He is the Cloud Rider
- C. Acts 1:9–12
  - based on this passage, the broader Christian vision of Jesus' return is that it will be a sunny day with cumulus clouds. However, Jesus describes His return differently

#### III. JESUS DESCRIBES HIS RETURN

- A. Matthew 24:29–31
  - 1) after the cosmic signs, the sign of the Son of Man will appear
  - 2) Jesus is quoting from Zechariah 12
    - a) in the original context of the passage, it is talking about the inhabitants of Jerusalem
  - this is the same language Paul and other Biblical writers use when discussing the rapture
- B. Revelation 1:7
  - again, when it says Jesus is coming with the clouds, it is referring to Daniel 7; and when it says all the tribes will see Him, it is referring to Zecheriah 12
    - a) those are the two primary texts cited by Jesus to refer to His return
- C. Matthew 24:29–31, Mark 13:24–27, Luke 21:25–28
  - all these accounts reference Jesus, the Son of Man, "coming in the clouds" or "a cloud"
- D. There is something distinctly Jewish about Jesus' return that Jews will recognize, so what is it? I submit to you that it will be Jesus returning in the pillar of cloud which causes the Jews to recognize Him as the Messiah.

# Isaiah 62: Raise up people intercessors for Israel God will not hold His peace until Israel becomes praise to the Nations; He set watchman on the wall to not keep silent

- Pray for Israel and the church's endurance during the Jacob's trouble / great tribulation
- Israel's national repentance; to turn to God wholeheartedly and obey
   His commands/laws
  - Pray Psalm 91 over Israel
